RIPLEY - E.E. Bill Covey, 68, of Ripley, died Thursday, October 27, 2005 from heart failure

following stomach surgery.



He was born May 2, 1937 in Cheyenne, WY and raised Wheatland, a son of the late George and Elnor Covey.

During his long and varied career, he was a professional barber and hair stylist. He was a rodeo rider and a fast-draw champion. He was a master chef in several locations. As a contractor who built homes in South Carolina, Wyoming, Arizona and West Virginia, he worked all phases of construction.

Bill was a paramedic in Smoot and supervisor in Search and Rescue on Cody, WY. He served as a hunter safety instructor in both Wyoming and West Virginia.
