

Elanore Hugelmeyer Greenville, MD



RIPLEY - Elanore Rogers Hugelmeyer of Greenville, MD, formerly of Ripley, went

home to be with the Lord peacefully in her sleep on August 1, 2006.

Elanore was a native of Ripley, WV. She graduated from Bowling Green College of Commerce with an A.B. degree. She was selected as Miss Bowling Green and represented the school at the Mountain Laurel Festival in Pineville, KY. Elanore then continued her education at Marshall University and New York University where she earned her Masters Degree. She was a member of the Delta Pi Epsilon Honorary Graduate Fraternity at New York University. She also belonged to Pi Kappa Sigma Sorority at Marshall University. She was a descendant of Benjamin Rush, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. She was also a descendant of Charles Parsons, a Revolutionary War soldier. Because of this relationship, she was approved and inducted on June 7, 1951 as a member of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Ravenswood, WV chapter.

As the wife of her beloved husband Chuck, she spent many years traveling throughout the world due to his military assignments in the Navy and throughout his employment with the DuPont company which took the entire family on a four year European assignment to Holland.

The family lived in many places including: Charleston, WV; Parkersburg WV; Zwijndrecht, Holland, Fayetteville, NC; and Greenville, DE. Elanore taught high school in Freeport (Long Island), NY, Parkersburg, WV and Fayetteville, NC.

While living in Holland she taught at The International School of The Hague, Netherlands. When Elanore moved to Greenville, DE in late 1975, she applied for and was offered a position as a full professor at Goldey Beacom College. She taught there from 1976, until she retired in 1991. She was the recipient of the Christian R. & Mary F. Lineback Award for Excellence in Teaching, which she received on June 8, 1980.

Survivors include her sons, Dr. Charles D. Hugelmeyer and his wife Laurie, and Bruce R. Hugelmeyer and his wife Jennifer; brother, Raleigh Shinn Rogers and his wife Patricia; and grandchildren Ellie, Brian, Scott, J.P., Addie, and Joellen.

She was preceded in death by her husband Charles; brothers Robert P. Rogers and Bernard Rogers; and grandchildren Dara, David, and Rachael.
