## **Margaret Andolee Parsons**

Margaret Andolee Parsons, 81, of Spencer died Oct. 18, 2008, at Eldercare of West Virginia after a long illness.

Margaret was born April 20, 1917, in Spencer and was a daughter of the late Peter S. Sr. and Naomi Wright Criss. Her stepmother was Vinnie Criss.

She was a graduate of Spencer High School and a member of United Memorial United Methodist Church, Spencer, where she was a member of the choir. After her marriage to her husband, Talmadge C.
